

Suspicious Activity results in drug arrest.

On Monday, December 8, 2014 at approximately 2209 hours, Police Officers Travis Cangialosi and Michael Ferrarini were dispatched to the area of Sussex Road and Eton Road on the report of a suspicious, occupied vehicle, called in by the resident.

Upon arrival, the officers observed a vehicle on Eton Road occupied and approached the party sitting in the driver's seat. The party, a 19-year-old male from Ringwood, opened the door to converse with the officers.

The officers immediately smelled the overwhelming odor of burnt marijuana emanating from the vehicle. When asked for the Ringwood man's driver's license, he could not provide it. The Ringwood man was asked about his presence in this area, the reason he could not provide documentation of his identification, and the reason for the smell of burnt marijuana in his vehicle. The Ringwood man could not provide any answer, except that he stated he had smoke marijuana three hours ago. Corporal Saverio Fasciano arrived on scene as the back-up officer.

The Ringwood man voluntarily surrendered a multicolored pipe, commonly used to smoke marijuana, with a greenish brown residue in it believed to be remnants of burnt marijuana. A search of the vehicle yielded a grinder utilized to break up marijuana.

The Ringwood man was placed under arrest and transported to the Washington Township Police Department. His vehicle was towed and impounded.

The Ringwood man was charged with the criminal charge of possession of drug paraphernalia, and motor vehicle summonses for possession of cds in a motor vehicle and failure to exhibit documents.
