

ORDINANCE No. 15-09

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING - FOR THE ACQUISITION OF NEW AND ADDITIONAL VEHICULAR EQUIPMENT BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WASHINGTON, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$765,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$728,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WASHINGTON, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), **AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of Washington, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$765,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and including the sum of \$37,000 as the down payment for said improvement or purpose required by law and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Township for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose and to meet the part of said \$765,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment, negotiable bonds of the Township are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$728,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes

of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$728,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the acquisition, by purchase, of new and additional vehicular equipment for use by the Department of Municipal Facilities of the Township, including two (2) dump trucks and one (1) sanitation refuse truck, together with all equipment, accessories and appurtenances necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$728,000.

(c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$765,000, the excess thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of the said \$37,000 down payment for said purpose.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is five (5) years.

(c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$728,000, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$40,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations and other items of expense listed in and permitted under section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the cost of said improvement and is included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer, provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the

governing body of the Township at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 7. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Township Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

Ordinance No. 15-10

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING FEES
FOR USE OF TOWNSHIP FACILITIES

BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Washington that Chapter 5 of the Code of the Township of Washington be and is hereby amended by adding Section 5-94 entitled "Facilities Use Fees" thereto as follows:

1. "5-94. Facilities Use Fees.

A. Classification of Users

Organizations and individuals using Township facilities will be classified as Class I, II, III, IV, or V users as follows:

1. Class I users will be given priority for the use of Township facilities over other users and may use Township facilities without payment of a use fee or charge for service costs. Class I users include the following organizations and individuals:

a. Uses and groups directly related to the Township and the operations of the Township, including all Departments of the Township.

2. Class II users will be given priority for the use of Township facilities over Class III and IV users and may be charged a use fee and service costs, where applicable. Class II users include the following organizations and individuals:

a. Uses and organizations indirectly related to the Township, including the Golden Senior's Club of the Township of Washington (Class IIa) and the Washington Township Baseball and Softball (Class IIb)

Class III users will be given priority for the use of Township facilities over Class IV users and may be charged a use fee and service costs, where applicable. Class III users include the following organizations and individuals:

a. Departments, agencies and official sport teams conducted through Westwood Regional School District.

4. Class IV users will be given priority for the use of Township facilities over Class V users and may be charged a use fee and service costs, where applicable. Class IV users include the following organizations and individuals:

- a. Community organizations formed for charitable, civic, social, or educational purposes (within the Township);
- b. Community political organizations (within the Township);
- c. Community church groups (within the Township);
- d. Township resident groups requesting use of Picnic facilities;
- e. Other governmental agencies within the Pascack Valley;

5. Class V users will be given lowest priority for the use of Township facilities and may use Township facilities only on payment of a use fee and charges for service costs, where applicable. Class V users include the following organizations and individuals:

- a. Community organizations formed for charitable, civic, social, or educational purposes (outside the Township);
- b. Community political organizations (outside the Township);
- c. Community church groups (outside the Township);
- d. Non-resident groups requesting use of Picnic facilities;
- e. Other governmental agencies outside the Pascack Valley;

6. Outdoor lighting shall incur a fee for Class III, IV and V users as established in Section B(4) of this Ordinance.

7. No organizations or individuals shall be permitted to use Township facilities without express written authorization in the form of a permit issued by the Township.

B. Fee Schedule

1. The Recreation Department shall prepare an itemized invoice for the use of Township facilities based on the approved application form. The invoice will be sent to the representative of the applicant organization at least ten (10) working days in advance of the use and is payable immediately.

2. Payment must be received by the Recreation Department before the scheduled use. Permission shall be withdrawn for any use that is not paid in advance, except as expressly exempted by the Business Administrator.

4. Other service costs in addition to Facility Usage Fee Schedule (based on three-hour block, additional hours will be prorated):

a. \$100 - Field Lighting at Memorial Field

b. DMF employee costs (include overtime plus appropriate administrative fees based on current Collective Bargaining Agreement with DMF):

b. \$65/hour - Monday through Saturday

c. \$87/hour - Sundays and Holidays."

2. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

3. All Ordinances or any provisions of any ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies and not otherwise.

4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication and in accordance with the Charter, and subject to such emergency resolution as may be adopted pursuant to Section 17-32 thereof. [R.S. 40:69A-181 (b)].
